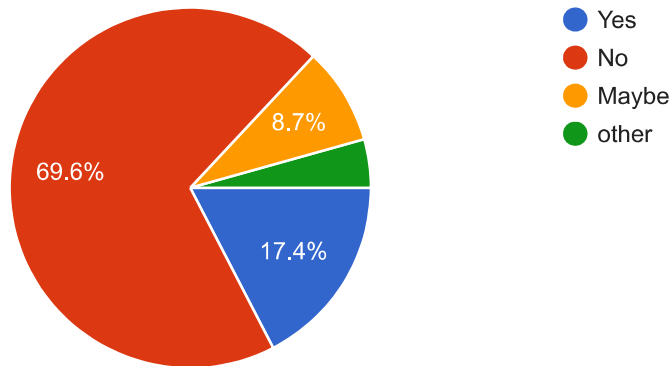

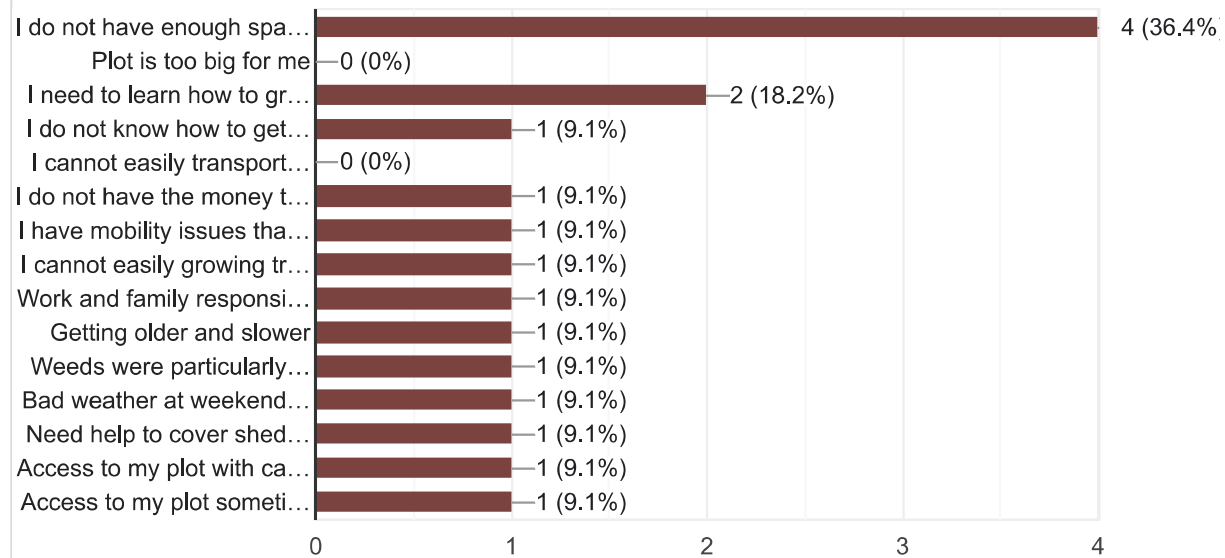

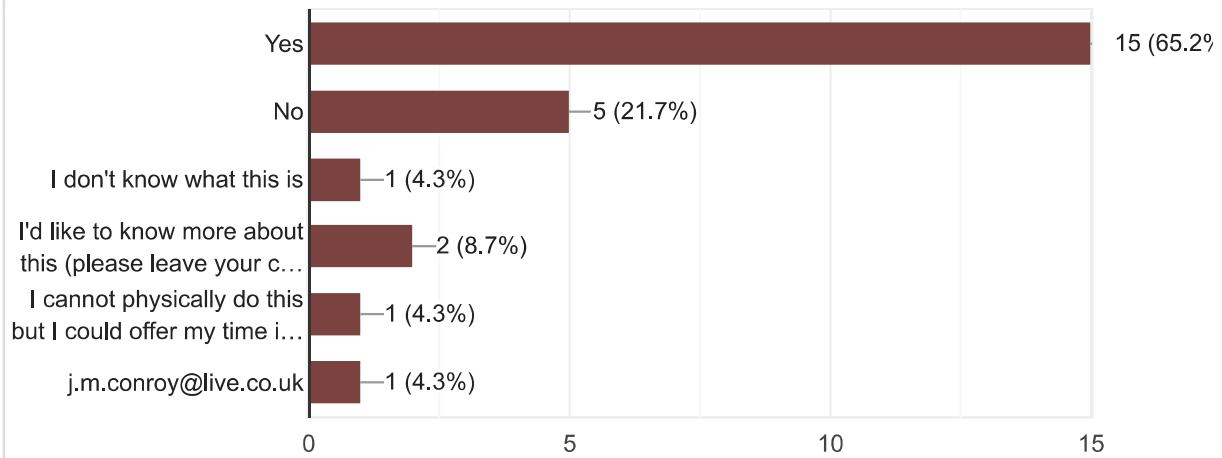

Have you ever contributed your time to a 'work day' on the Southern Allotments site? (These are advertised days when all plot holders chip in and help improve the site for everyone)



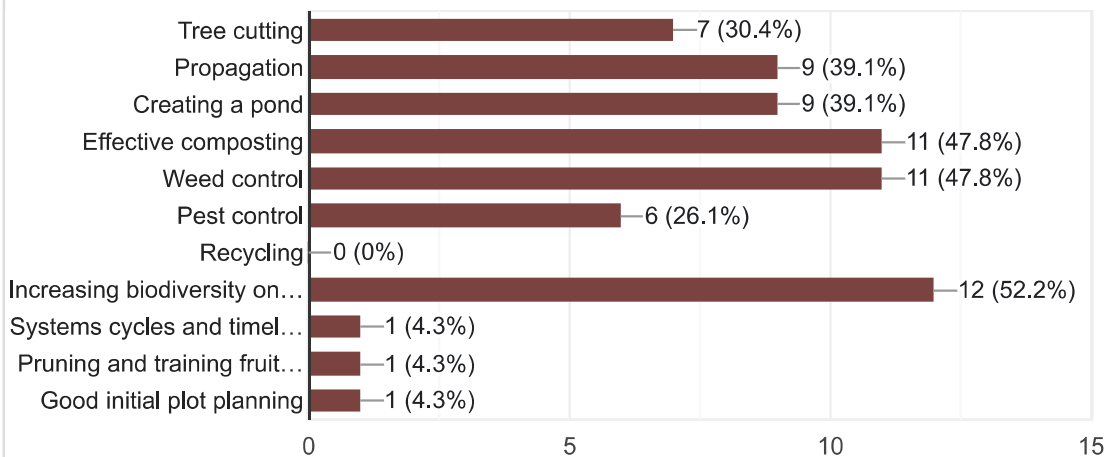

What type of education offer would you like to see made available through the society?



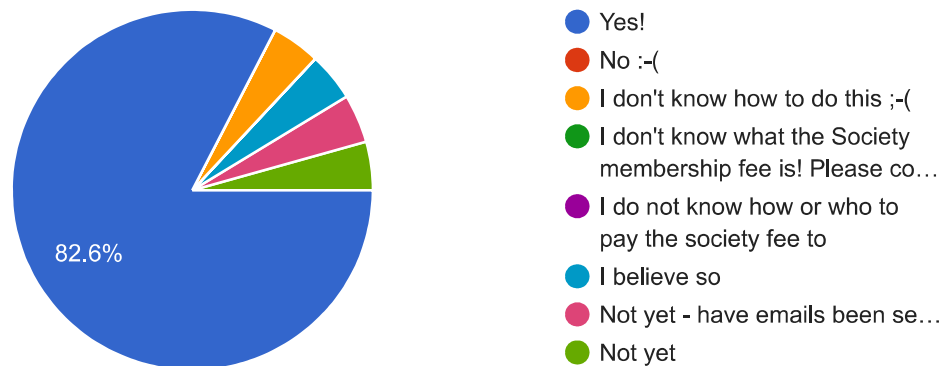
